OTHER AGENCY BUSINESS:

Mrs. Bunt provided an update on the purchase price for CRA-owned property located at 1626 Orange Blossom Trail NE. The final sale price was now \$171,407.74 due to the purchaser finalizing a revised survey of the property including the triangular parcel to the north of the BCRA's parcel showing the total square footage was less than anticipated. This price also reflected the \$71,854.25 reduction in purchase price that the Board previously approved due to the buyer's, Adelon Real Estate Manager, LLC, costs associated with environmental remediation for removal of arsenic on the property. Ms. Smith concurred with Mrs. Bunt's update.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS:

Commissioner Weinberg questioned if the savings from the tax increment (TIF) funding would be returned to the City's Road Maintenance General Fund or some other fund once the Bayfront CRA sunsetted. Chairman Medina also mentioned that the Board previously discussed using the savings for business tax incentives to enhance the City's commercial tax base.

Vice-Chairman Felix asked if staff could provide an update on development in the Bayfront area over the past few years, to include the recently sold Pelican Harbor Marina property.
